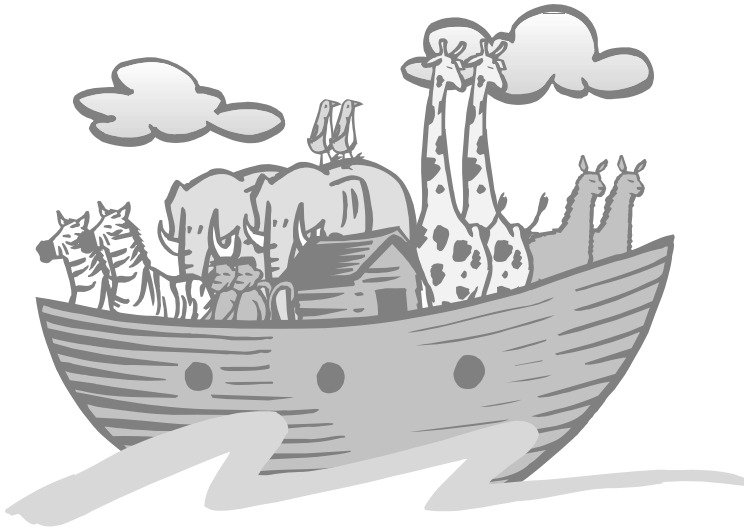


All I Really Need to Know I Learned from
